Report from Superintendent Gord Stewart:

Enrollment:

Langley is off to strong start. Student numbers are not increasing at as great a rate as expected - 200-300 students instead of the projected 500-600. Numbers will be finalized and funding complete by December.

Cannabis:

There have been questions regarding the legalization of cannabis and what that may mean for area schools. As there are already alcohol policies in place, it makes little difference to school policies, the same language has been adopted.

DPAC was thanked for their work in the district. He confirmed that all trustees were still serving on their current committees while campaigning. There will be a representative present from the new board at the next meeting.
